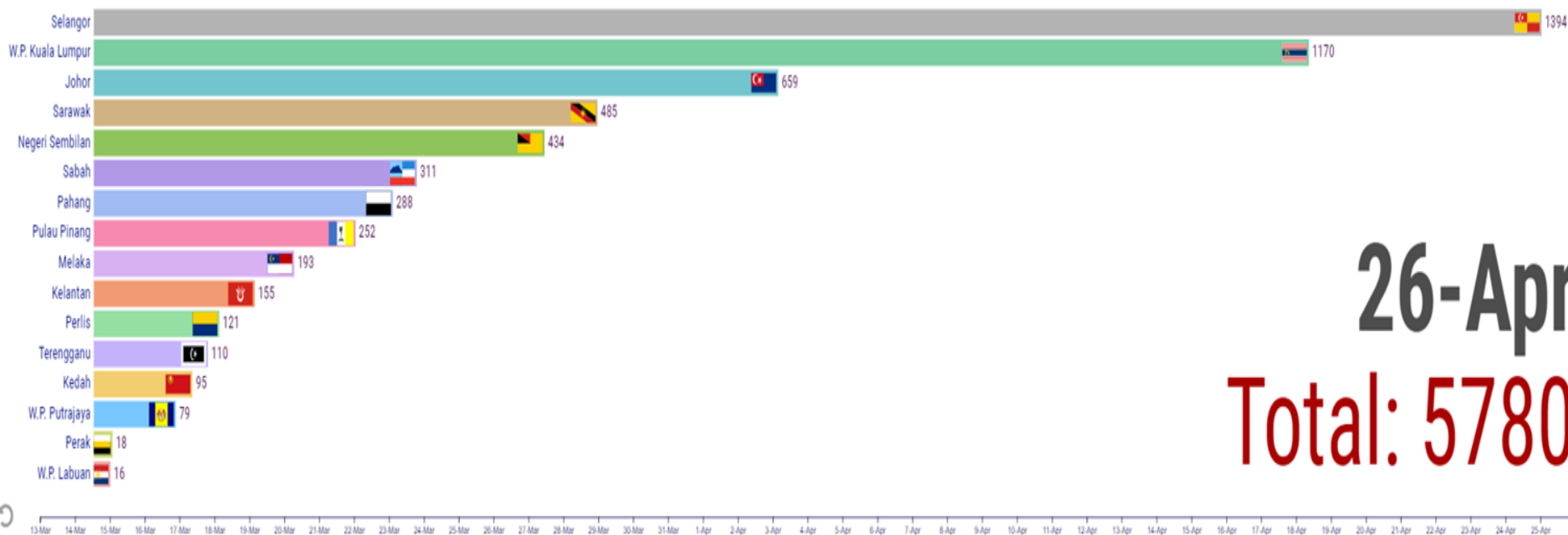

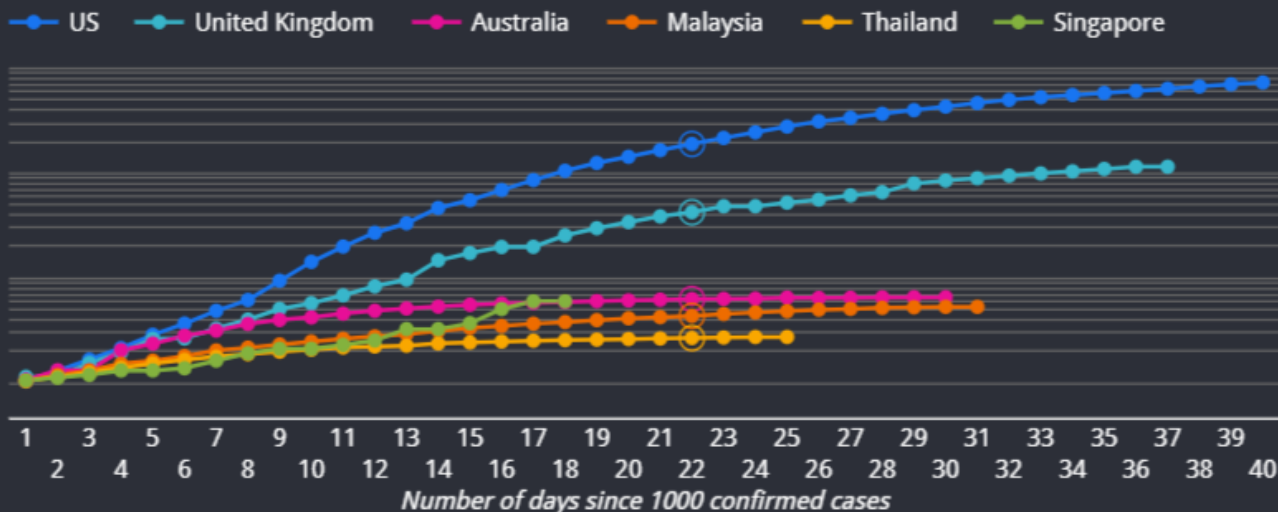

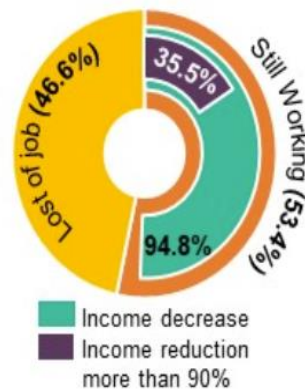

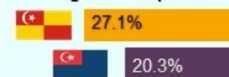

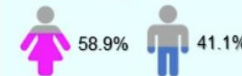

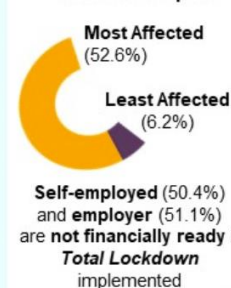

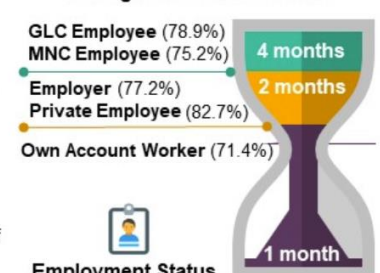

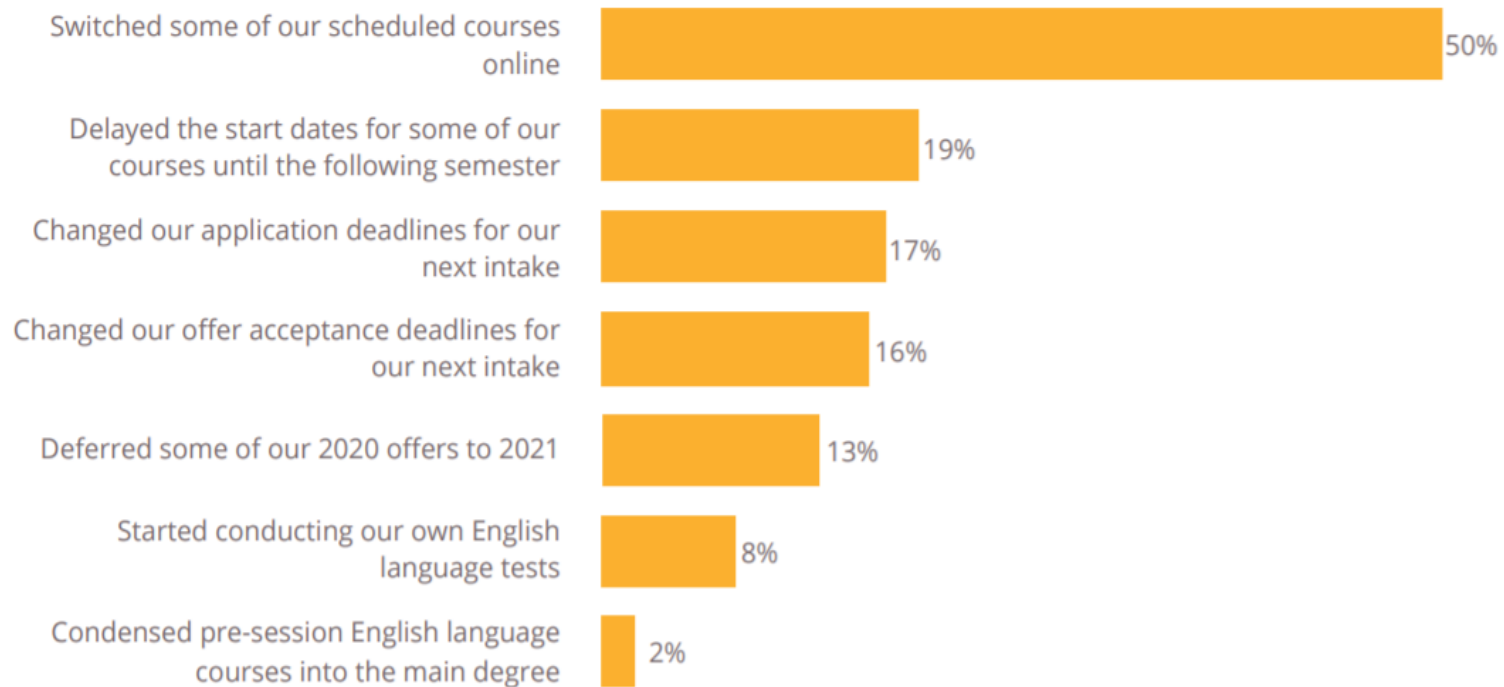
QS has published a comprehensive report of the findings: [*The Impact of the Coronavirus on Global Higher Education*](#).

This includes findings on how prospective international students are responding to the coronavirus.

- 46% of respondents stated that the coronavirus had impacted their plans to study abroad.
- 47% had decided to defer their entry until next year, 13% now intend to study in a different country, and 8% no longer want to study abroad.
