Based on the evidence sighted, panel affirms that the vision, mission and goals have been developed in consultation with principal stakeholders, however the evidence is insufficient to support there is an extensive consultation has been done.

CASE 3: AL 1

Standard 1.3.1 – The academic staff **MUST** be given sufficient autonomy to focus on areas of his expertise...

Based on the interview with the academic staff, panel found that the academic staff is not given any autonomy to focus on areas of his expertise. Most of them claimed that it was difficult to get approval from the management for them to conduct research or getting involve in community engagement.
